

Covid-19: Summary of current rules at MU

THE O-N-T SYSTEM

In Czech, Očkování (Vaccination) – Nemoc (Illness) – Testování (Testing) is a way to prove that one meets the conditions allowing them to enter their workplace, teaching facilities or service facilities. It is based on three basic pillars: vaccination, testing and previous covid-19 diagnosis.

MU BUILDINGS

O-N-T employees – obligation to provide proof of vaccination, illness or regular antigen testing of all employees of SARS-CoV-2 virus through a rapid on-site antigen test for self-testing or by means of a rapid antigen test performed by a healthcare provider at a frequency of at least once a week



O-N-T students – after arrival from abroad and for the purpose of accommodation; then according to the decisions of the deans of MU faculties and economic units

Employees and students must report their O-N-T status in MU information systems. Members of the public have restricted access to MU buildings. The only exceptions are for employees of companies that provide goods and services necessary for ensuring MU's operations and for MU's partners who must take part in critical meetings that cannot be held online.

RESPIRATORS:

University buildings – respirator or a similar device without exhalation valve meeting at least all technical conditions and requirements, including filtration effectiveness of at least 94 % pursuant to the applicable standards (e.g. FFP2, KN 95), that prevents the transmission of particles.

EXCEPTIONS:

- lecturers or teachers
- music, sports (PE)
- employees and students must wear a respirator in all indoor areas at MU
- exceptions are made for when a single person is in a room by themselves or for lecturers, speakers, or teachers who are engaged in a teaching activity in which a respirator cannot be worn (especially for physical education, singing, and playing wind instruments) while keeping at least 1.5 metres away from others, and for students who are exercising or singing. The exception for wearing a respirator is applicable only to teaching and academic staff who have been vaccinated against COVID-19 and at least 14 days have elapsed since the completion of the vaccination schedule according to the summary of product characteristics and only in situations in which they are providing education.

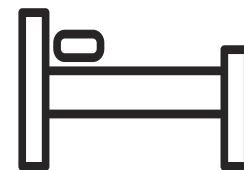
Following the MU traffic-light system, in-person classes are limited to a maximum of 150 people in one room.

Based on local conditions and the prevalence of the infection the dean, director of institution or any other head of department decide, in legitimate cases, on the obligation to use respirators in cases not explicitly outlined by the rules.

DORMS

O-N-T students – mandatory testing every 7 days, PCR tests only

- respirators in common areas
- reflection of conditions for the arrival from foreign countries



LIBRARIES

- 1 client per 10 square metres
- 1.5 metre distances
- respirator or a similar device without exhalation valve meeting at least all technical conditions and requirements, including filtration effectiveness of at least 94 % pursuant to the applicable standards (e.g. FFP2, KN 95), that prevents the transmission of particles
- libraries are closed to the public, the in-person pick-up or drop-off of materials may be restricted based on each faculty's decision



ASSEMBLY AND PUBLIC EVENTS

- in the case of public events, limits on number of attendees
- distancing
- respirator or a similar device without exhalation valve meeting at least all technical conditions and requirements, including filtration effectiveness of at least 94 % pursuant to the applicable standards (e.g. FFP2, KN 95), that prevents the transmission of particles
- obligation to verify O-N-T



ARRIVAL FROM ABROAD (NOT JUST FOREIGNERS)

- restriction on entry if conditions are not met
- countries are categorised (5 groups)
- obligation to report return via INET and IS
