Study records and personal data

Study records are maintained via an internet information system of Masaryk University (also known as "IS"), to which student will obtain access ID number and password after his acceptance to school.

Through this system the student has access to his education records such as evaluation of exams given directly by the examiner, grades and credits obtained during all studies and grade average or register for and enrol in courses. For more information about IS please visit:

IS also includes personal data of the student such as passport number, contact address, date and place of birth, sex etc.

Beside study records and personal data maintaining through IS, those files are also kept in paper form at International Studies Office.

Personal data and study records included are accessible only by student via unique ID and authorised university employees for internal purposes of Masaryk University only.

Masaryk University has no right to demand any health records from students.

Course credit transfer

Masaryk University is a part of the ECTS (European Credit Transfer System). It is a credit system for the evaluation of higher education based on student workload. The system was originally conceived within the Erasmus programme framework as a tool designed to facilitate student mobility by enabling the comparison and recognition of international studies. Today it is used as a credit accumulation system on both national and international levels in most European countries.

Degree programs Information access

Masaryk University owns the only one official information system of its activities and providing services, which is available at https://is.muni.cz/.

Through this system university provides, among others, Degree Programmes, Fields and Specializations Catalogue and Course Catalogue, which serves as an official list of education programs and courses (including lists of Teachers, Timetable of Seminar Groups, Prerequisites, Course Enrolment Limitation, Course objectives etc.) taught at its faculties, including the Faculty of Medicine.

Degree programs are subject to internal controls of Rector's Office of Masaryk University and the Accreditation commission which examines whether these programs meets the official requirements.

Those information mentioned above are accessible by public, which means they can be taken and misused by third party. From that reason trust only information published at https://is.muni.cz/.

Graduates after graduation
